In pursuance of the State Project Directorate, Rashtriya Uchchatra Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA), Govt. of Manipur Order No. 60/SPD-RUSA/2020(Pt), one day sensitization programme was organized on National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF-2021), All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) on 15th April 2021 at the Conference Hall of Moreh College, Moreh.

The one day sensitization programme on NAAC, AISHE & NIRF-2021 started as scheduled and planned under the initiative of IQAC, Moreh College on 15th April 2021. The programme started by initially honoring the President and Resource Persons followed by the welcome address from Dr. Seiyang Baite. Thereafter, the programme was followed by the keynote address which was delivered by Dr. S. Dillipkumar Singh after which Shri. Imo Singh, Assistant Professor of Mathematics Department delivered the Presidential address on behalf of the Principal who was unable to attend due to ill health.

Three persons from amongst the faculty members of Moreh College was selected beforehand to speak on respective theme. Accordingly, the selected ones spoke as resource persons during the technical session. Altogether 176 participants attended the programme which includes students, representatives from CSOs and teachers.

SPEAKER 1: Dr. Shyamjai Singh
Co-ordinator IQAC, Moreh College, Moreh

The first speaker spoke on the topic “NAAC and Its Essentiality in Higher Education” wherein he mentions that the primary goal of institutional accreditation by NAAC is to provide the information needed to improve the experience of the 'learning communities', also to envisage that NAAC plays a larger role in internalizing and institutionalizing quality assurance. He further states that the prime agenda of NAAC is to assess and accredit institutions of higher learning with all objective of helping them to work continuously to improve the quality of education.

While opining the responsibilities of teachers to develop the College, the speaker mentions that NAAC accreditation helps the higher learning institutes to know its strengths, opportunities, and weaknesses through an informed review process and also helps in identifying internal areas of planning and resource allocations.

Dr. Shyamjai elaborately discusses on the vision of NAAC in which he said that the vision of NAAC is to make quality the defining element of higher education in India through a combination of self and external quality evaluation, promotion and sustenance initiatives.

The mission of NAAC which aim at translating is vision into action plans are:

- To arrange for periodic assessment and accreditation of institutions of higher education or units thereof, or specific academic programmes or projects;
- To stimulate the academic environment for promotion of quality in teaching-learning and research in higher education institutions;
- To encourage self-evaluation, accountability, autonomy and innovations in higher education;
- To undertake quality-related research studies, consultancy and training programmes,

- To collaborate with other stakeholders of higher education for quality evaluation, promotion and sustenance.

While delivering on NAAC and its essentiality in Higher Education, the resource persons highlighted the five core values of NAAC in the accreditation framework.

1. Contributing to National Development
2. Fostering Global Competencies among Students
3. Inculcating a Value System among Students
4. Promoting the Use of Technology
5. Quest for Excellence

The third and last speaker of the programme was N. Pradipkumar Singh. He spoke on “National Institutional Ranking Framework- NIRF 2021”. He stated that in order to fulfill the need for an up-to-date and comprehensive data on higher education for effective policy making and planning, MHRD initiated All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) in 2011 and subsequently launched National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) in 2015. The speaker stated that the ranking of NIRF is based on certain parameters which are organized into five broad heads.

After all the talks were meaningfully delivered on the theme, the programme ended with the vote of thanks from Dr. Ch. Sekholal Kom, Member of IQAC Moreh College and Assistant Professor of Political Science, Moreh College, Moreh.
